Referring to applied linguistics, Mary said she appreciates its scientific approach to language and is eager to learn more. To be nominated by the Department, please hand in the supporting documents to the Department by 29th October, 2019:

- a letter of recommendation addressed to the donor, Mr. To Yuet-lai, on appropriate letterhead paper
- transcript (downloaded from CUSIS)
- a copy of transcripts with explanatory notes of the grading system on an exchange programme (if applicable). Any downloaded transcripts are NOT accepted.
- copies of evidence of ALL international prizes received as CUHK representative /delegate (e.g. certificates / letters / photos of trophies / medal. etc.)

The deadline of the **Bei Shan Tang Foundation Scholarship**, a full scholarship for pursuing a full-time taught Master's degree at the Stanford Graduate School of Education in the academic year 2020/21, has been has extended to 4th November 2019.
